Fleetwood Brougham

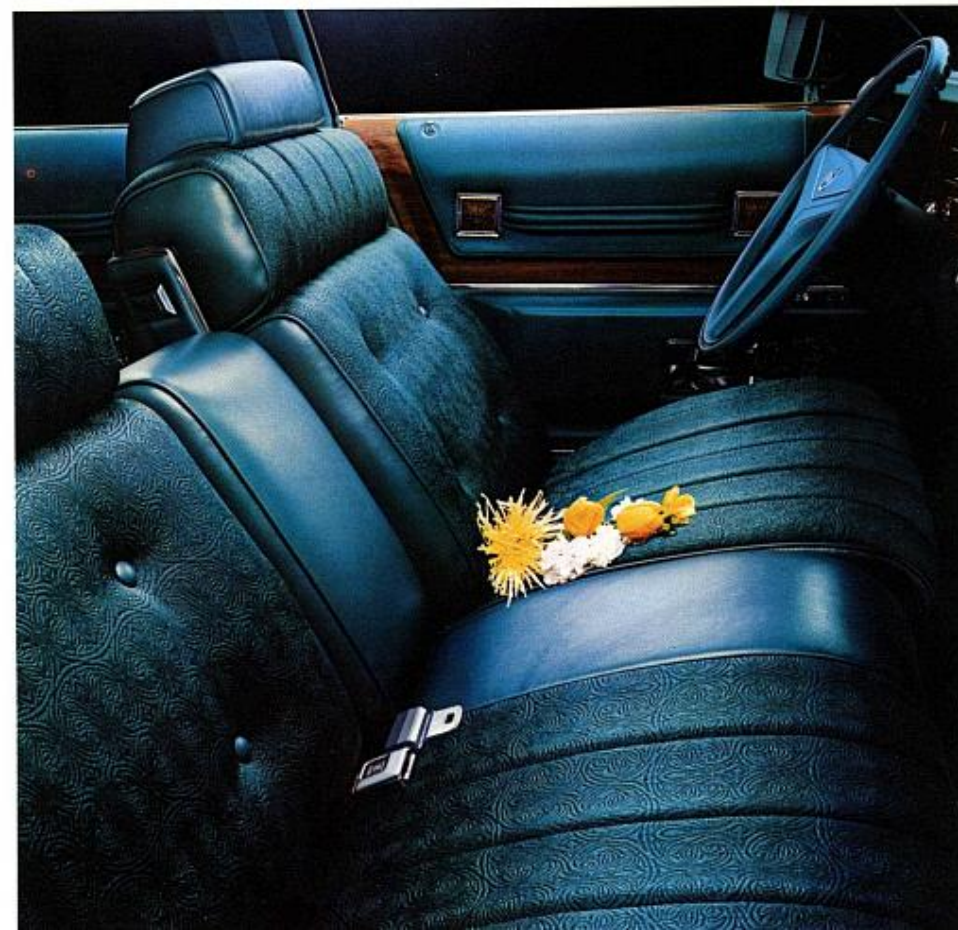

And accented further by an exciting new choice of upholsteries. There is new Mapi, a lustrous matelasse in any of four colors. (Dark Teal is shown.) Soft and supple Sierra grain leathers are available in any of nine colors. Or you may

order Medici, a crushed velour now available in Dark Blue, Maize and Taupe, as well as Beige. Now complementing the rear reading lights is a new adjustable light for the front passenger. Added luxuries available include a lap robe and pillow, and a deluxe trim package that includes deep-pile, two-toned shag carpeting, rubber-backed floor mats for the front and rear, and shirred elastic pockets on the back of the front seats.

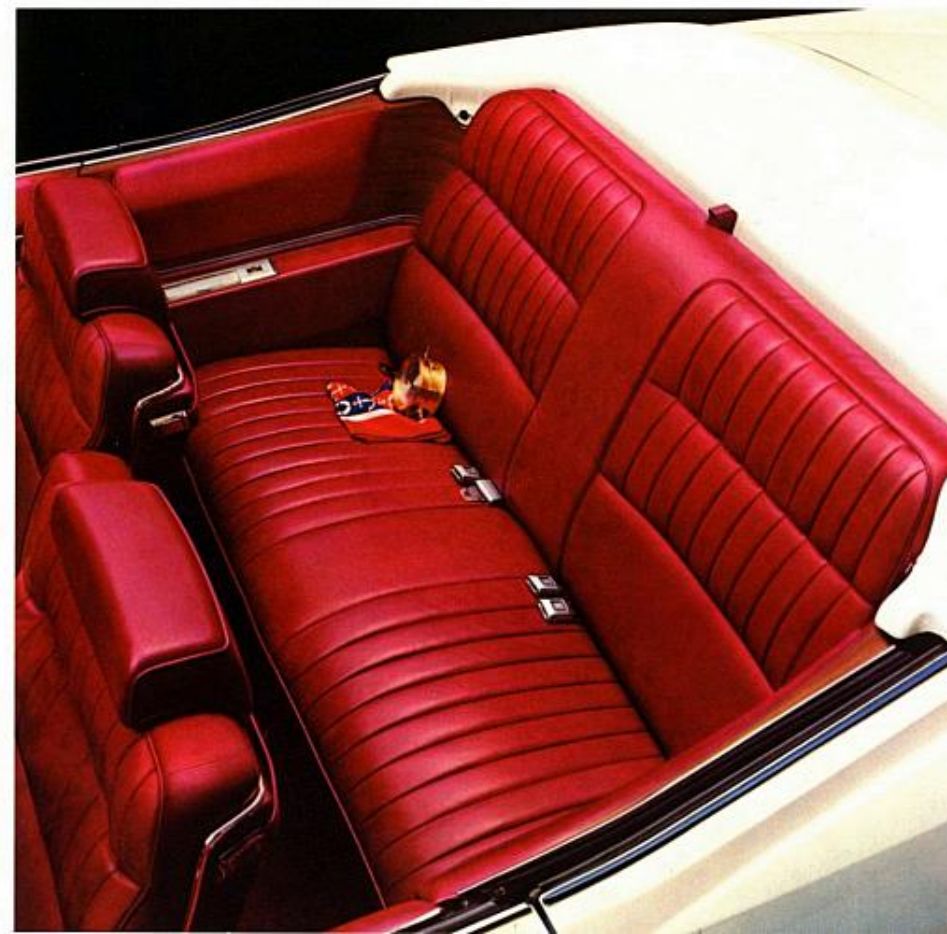

The richness of soft, pliable Sierra grain leather is standard in the Eldorado Convertible. With nine colors from which to choose—including White leather with your choice of four carpet colors. Shown is Medium Red (Scarlet) leather with Scarlet carpet. The inward-folding Hideaway Top is smooth and taut when it's up. When it's lowered, the frame folds

inward behind the seat, to afford full-width seating for the rear passengers. Two things that haven't changed are four-door roominess and that great Cadillac ride (except to make it even better with redesigned body mounts and the use of Teflon piston rings in shock absorbers for more consistent ride control). Luxuries you may add include a lighted vanity mirror, lamp monitors and a Dual Comfort front seat. Shown is the Sedan deVille in available St. Tropez Blue Firemist with a Dark Blue padded vinyl roof.

Added touches of luxury inside have their own story to tell of Sedan deVille value and popularity. The "soft-pillow" door panels over a base of rosewood vinyl. New, larger pull straps anchored by escutcheons with a chrome scrollwork insert (see inset). A handsome new Cadillac clock with Roman numerals and set between raised scrolls. A fully illuminated

windshield wiper control. And many more. A beautiful new multi-textured weave known as Medallion cloth is offered in Dark Blue, as shown, Dark Taupe, Dark Jade and Black. Also available is Mirabelle, a sophisticated fabric in Dark Teal, Medium Beige and Medium Maize. Or, if you prefer, you may order leather in any of twelve trim combinations.

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Calais Sedan



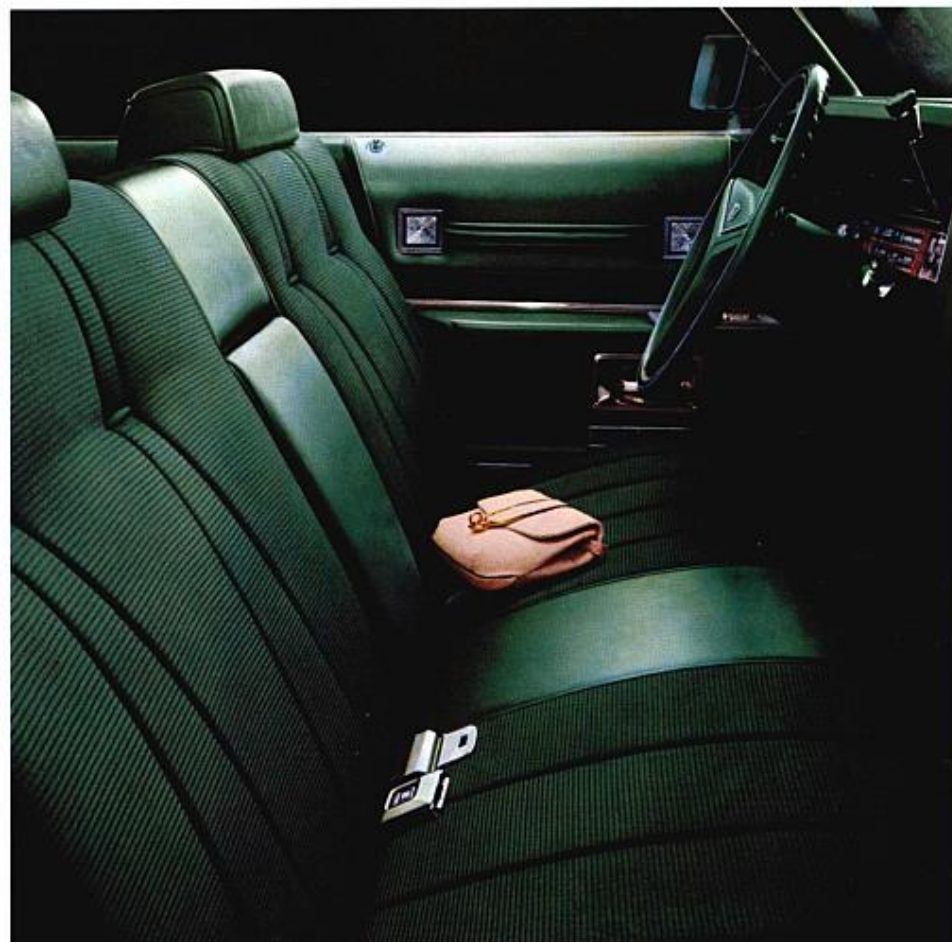

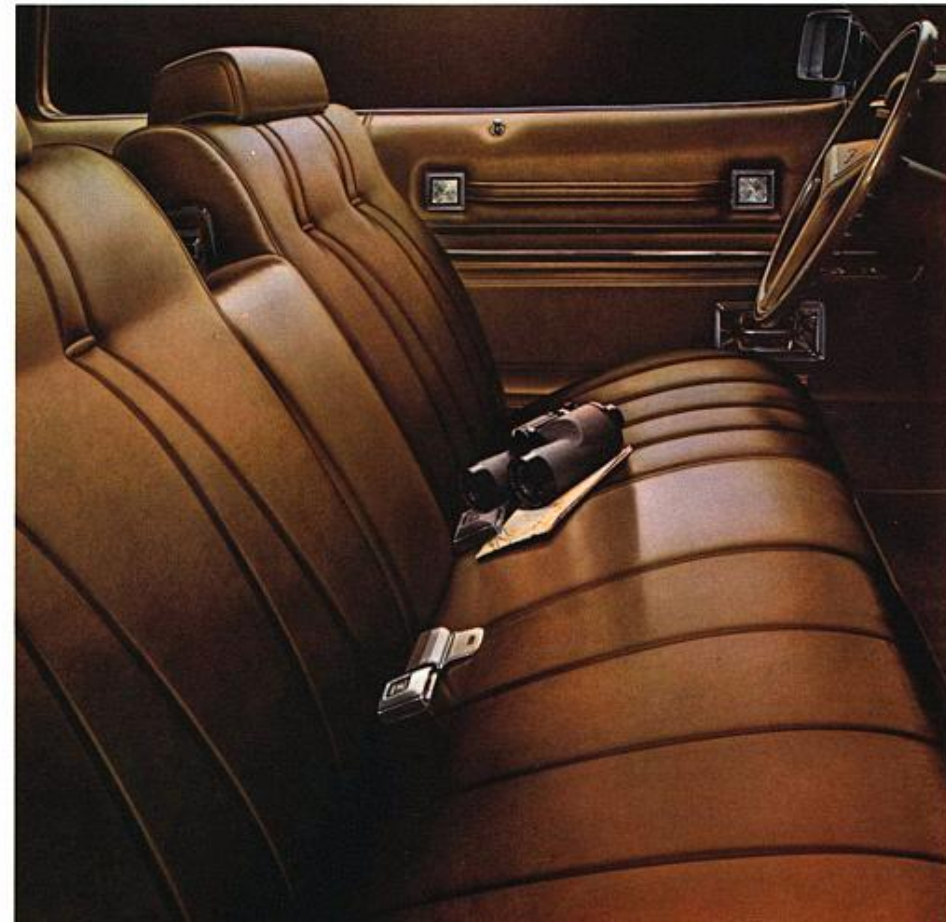

pendable Cadillac engine. In reliability. The Calais Coupe is a Cadillac, meaning it receives the infinite care in manufacture that characterizes all Cadillacs. In value. Cadillac traditionally has the highest resale of any car built in the land. And in individuality. You can order from a wide choice of added luxuries, including a signal-seeking stereo radio, steel-belted radial tires and many more. Shown is the Calais Coupe in Laredo Tan.

Everything inside tells you this is a Cadillac. From the "soft-pillow" door panels to the artfully curved instrument panel to the little niceties you expect in a Cadillac. Niceties like an electric clock, a front center armrest, cornering lights, assist straps and a remote-control left-side

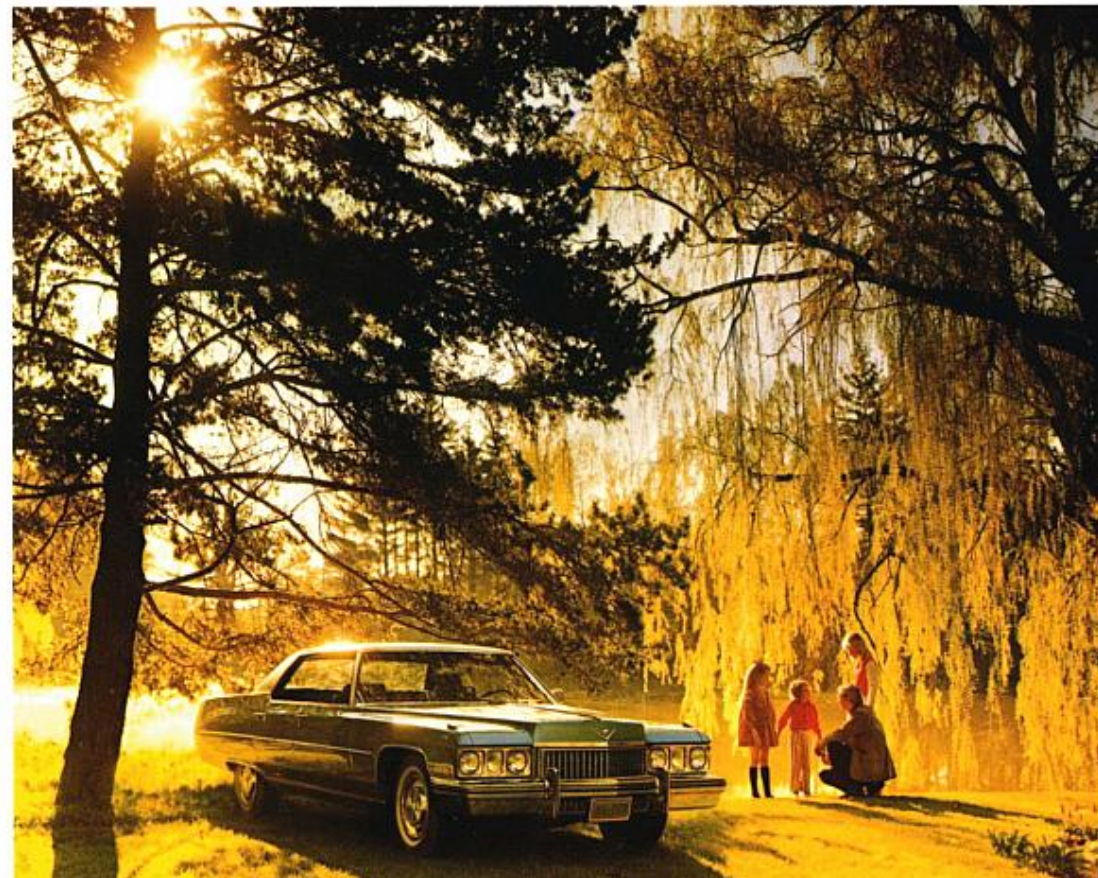

A source of special satisfaction is how considerate your new Cadillac is of the environment. And how attentive it is to your personal well-being. In fact, you might be surprised by the scope of Cadillac's involvement in two areas of such great concern today—safer highways and cleaner air. Yet, it was Cadillac, after all, that first equipped its cars with electric starting and electric lights back in 1912. That first used tilt-beam headlights in 1915. That first installed safety glass in 1928. The Cadillacs of 1973 incorporate a host of safety features. Including single-buckle seat and shoulder belts for the driver and right front passenger, two front-seat head restraints, an energy absorbing steering column, a thick-

lamine windshield, side door beams and dozens more listed on the specifications page. And the Cadillacs of 1973 build on the success of more than a decade of progress toward cleaner air. The 1973 Cadillacs make further progress—especially in the area of oxides of nitrogen. By the use of an exhaust gas recirculation system, oxide of nitrogen emissions have been significantly reduced. Cadillac is doing something about traffic safety and air pollution but, of course, there are some things only you can do. For safety's sake we suggest you: (1) Always use seat and shoulder belts. (2) Make sure your car is in good running order. (3) Never drive when you're tired or under the influence of drugs or alcohol. (4) Drive defensively.





A source of added pleasure is the inviting array of luxury features and equipment you can order to individualize the Cadillac of your choice and to add to your motoring pleasure.

EIGHT RADIO SYSTEMS. A beautiful choice for 1973. First, there are the Cadillac radios themselves—each with marvelous fidelity. The AM/FM pushbutton stereo with an integral eight-track tape player and four speakers. Cadillac's exclusive AM/FM signal-seeking stereo radio with four speakers. And the AM/FM unit with front and rear speakers. Each is available in all models but Fleetwood Seventy-Fives with the windshield antenna or with the new automatic power-operated antenna. The power antenna, concealed in the fender, automatically rises when the radio is turned on and retracts when the radio or the ignition is turned off. For the Fleetwood Seventy-Fives, Cadillac offers the AM/FM signal-seeking stereo with control from the passenger compartment—either with the windshield antenna or power antenna.

OUTSIDE THERMOMETER. Mounted on the base of the left-side mirror, it tells the driver the outside temperature at a glance.

AUTOMATIC CLIMATE CONTROL. Set it to the temperature you desire, and this combined heating and cooling system—with even greater capacity and quietness for 1973—automatically cools you in the summer and warms you in the winter. It also dehumidifies the passenger compartment. For severe winter weather, you may move the lever to HI, which directs all warm air toward driver and passenger; to BI-LEVEL, which directs heat to both passenger compartment and to the windshield; or to DEF, which directs all the warm air to the windshield.

ELECTRICALLY OPERATED SUNROOF. By activating a con-

trol switch on the instrument panel, you can automatically open a panel in the roof to let the sun shine in—a little or a lot. Available on Brougham, Eldorado Coupe and DeVilles with vinyl roofs.

CRUISE CONTROL. A touch of this control at the tip of the directional turn signal lever, and your Cadillac automatically maintains a selected speed without using the accelerator pedal. Unit automatically disengages when you touch the brake pedal or turn off ignition.

TILT AND TELESCOPE STEERING WHEEL. Adjusts for both height and reach. Swings up for easier entry/exit.

LIGHTED VANITY MIRROR. A new added touch of luxury for the lady. Lifting the protective cover automatically turns on the lamps, one on each side of the mirror. A se-

lector switch regulates high or low intensity light. Tilted, it makes an excellent auxiliary map light.

LAMP MONITORS. Front fender monitors show if low- and high-beam headlights, parking lights and front turn signals are functioning. Monitor visible through rearview mirror shows if taillight and stop light/turn signals are functioning. Another monitoring system shows when windshield washer fluid is low through a warning light on the instrument panel.

POWER DOOR LOCKS. A touch of the finger on this electrical control in the power grouping locks and unlocks all doors. On coupes, it includes an automatic seat-back release that is activated when either door is opened.

TWILIGHT SENTINEL. This system has two major jobs. One, it automatically turns your driving lights on or off in response to light conditions. Two, it allows you to leave headlights and either cornering lamp on to light your path from the car; and then it automatically turns

them off. It also includes a warning buzzer that tells you when the manual headlight switch has been pulled out and inadvertently left on after the ignition is off.

STEEL-BELTED RADIAL TIRES. A deluxe, American-made steel-belted radial tire is now available for all series except the Fleetwood Seventy-Fives. Benefits include improved tread life and road hazard protection.

REMOTE-CONTROL TRUNK LOCK. Pressing a control button inside the glove compartment releases and raises the trunk lid. To close the trunk, it is only necessary to bring the trunk lid to a nearly closed position where the power trunk lock takes over and latches it securely. A light on the instrument panel warns when the lid is unlocked.

REMOTE-CONTROL RIGHT-SIDE MIRROR. Standard on the Seventy-Fives. Available on all other models.

SIX-WAY POWER SEAT ADJUSTER. Moves front seats forward, back, up, down and tilts forward or back.

DELUXE ROBE AND PILLOW. Robe and matching occa-

sional pillow are fashioned from Medici crushed velour in Dark Blue, Medium Beige, Medium Maize or Dark Taupe.

TRAILERING PACKAGE. This factory-installed grouping of heavy-duty equipment, for towing trailers between 2,000 and 6,000 pounds loaded, is available for all models except Seventy-Fives.

TRACK MASTER. A computerized, rear-wheel skid-control system.

REAR-WINDOW DE-FOGGER. Electric. Standard on Seventy-Fives. Available on all other models.

AUTOMATIC LEVEL CONTROL. Automatically adjusts to changing loads, to help keep the car level for a trim appearance and excellent handling.

THEFT-DETERRENT SYSTEM. This electronic system that operates off the ignition sounds the horn and flashes the exterior lights if the security of the vehicle, trunk or engine compartment is violated.

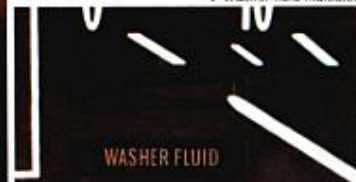

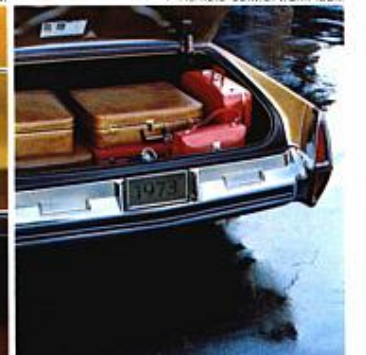

Specifications

ENGINE: Eight-cylinder, 90° V-type. Bore 4.30, stroke 4.06, displacement 472 cu. in. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 8.5 to 1.

ELDORADO ENGINE: Eight-cylinder, 90° V-type. Bore 4.30, stroke 4.304, displacement 500 cu. in. Compression ratio 8.5 to 1.

FUEL: Cadillac engines are designed to operate on a good quality fuel of approximately 91 Research Octane Number or higher, commonly sold in the U.S. and Canada. General Motors recommends the use of unleaded or low-lead (0 to 0.5 grams per gallon) gasolines to minimize emissions of hydrocarbons and particulates. If unleaded or low-lead gasolines are not available, gasolines containing more than 0.5 grams may be used. In states using the Gasoline Performance and Information System of fuel designation, unleaded or low-lead fuels having an anti-knock designation of "2" or higher are recommended.

FUEL TANK CAPACITY: Approximately 22.5 usable Imperial gallons. Tank designed to avoid possibility of vapor or liquid fuel escaping into atmosphere.

PISTONS: Aluminum alloy, slipper-type.

CAMSHAFT: Designed with greater overlap between intake and exhaust valve timing as an aid to reducing nitrous oxides in exhaust.

CARBURETOR: Quadrajet four-barrel down-draft with automatic choke.

LUBRICATION: Full-pressure. Full-flow oil filter.

ELECTRICAL SYSTEM: 12-volt, 15-plate battery. Side terminals. 42-amp. generator. 80-amp. on all Seventy-Fives. 63-amp. on all other air-conditioned cars. Generator has integral regulator.

TURBO HYDRA-MATIC: Fully automatic, torque-converter type with fixed stator. Converter multiplies engine torque for increased driving thrust to drive wheels during acceleration in any forward drive gear.

REAR AXLE: Ratio 2.93 to 1 (3.07 to 1 on Eldorado), 3.15 to 1 axle ratio is standard on Seventy-Five models, available on other models except Eldorado. Available (except Eldorado) is the controlled differential, which directs power to the rear wheel having better traction.

FRONT SUSPENSION: Integral steering knuckle for added dependability and long life. Independent, helical-coil-type springs. Rubber-mounted strut rods and rubber bushings absorb impacts and isolate road noise. Spindle has an integral hub and rotor. (Torsion bar suspension on Eldorado.) Shock absorbers have new Teflon piston rings to give consistent ride, handling.

REAR SUSPENSION: Four-link drive. Rear springs are helical-coil type. Large rubber bushings for quiet, soft ride.

BRAKES: Cadillac power brakes with self-adjusting feature; composite finned rear drums; disc front. Split hydraulic master cylinder provides for independent operation of front and rear brakes. Large two-piston power booster and larger front-wheel brake cylinders for increased capacity.

ENGINE BRAKE: True auxiliary brake... will lock in position with engine running. Can be operated as a foot brake while car is in motion. Automatically releases when transmission is shifted to neutral.

STEERING: Cadillac variable-ratio power steering with faster response and higher capacity pump is standard equipment (fixed-ratio on Seventy-Five models). Overall steering ratio of 17.8 to 1 (except 19.5 to 1 on Seventy-Five models and 16.1 to 1 on Eldorado). 38.5 turning angle provides fast response and short turning diameter.

FRAME: Perimeter frame with heavier gauge boxed side rails for 1973. New front members afford added protection with increased energy absorption.

TIRES: Low-pressure, size L78-15, bias-belted, fiberglass, tubeless, on all models. Black sidewalls standard, white sidewalls available.

CORNERING LIGHTS: On the side of front fenders activated by directional signal lever when headlamp switch is on. They project a beam of light from the side of the car, thus illuminating roadside and road signs for added convenience at night.

TREAD: Front 63.3", rear 63.3" (Eldorado, 63.66" front, 63.59" rear).

WHEELBASE: 130" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Brougham 133", Fleetwood Seventy-Five 151.5", Eldorado 126.3").

OVERALL LENGTH: 228.5" (Fleetwood Sixty Special Brougham 231.5", Fleetwood Seventy-Five 250.0", Eldorado 222.0").

NOTE: Richly textured vinyl is provided in certain areas of leather-trimmed Fleetwood and DeVille models.
